Hundreds of students get ready to Run4Bibles

Hundreds of Sydney Christian school students will be participating in Bible League's inaugural fundraising event for students, RUN4BIBLES, across the next two weeks.

The event, designed to coincide with each school's annual cross-country program, will involve students from Thomas Hassall Anglican College and Covenant Christian School running for Bibles this Wednesday, April 2 and students from Penrith Anglican College running for Bibles on Tuesday, April 8.

Family and friends are sponsoring students to run and place Bibles with Bible-less Christians in a region of their school's choice.

Thomas Hassall Anglican College will be fundraising to provide Bibles for the Burarra people of central north Arnhem Land in Australia's Northern Territory. Covenant Christian School is fundraising to place God's Word in China, and Penrith Anglican College will be fundraising to place Bibles in Africa.

Bible League's National Director Grahame Smith said that participating students would make a tremendous difference in the lives of many.

"RUN4BIBLES provides an opportunity to participate in an event which will have an eternal impact," Grahame said. "Lives will change as God's Word is read, believed and put into action.

"Millions of Christians around the world do not have access to God's Word because of poverty, persecution, lack of availability and geographical remoteness. Each \$7 raised through sponsorship will provide a Bible for a Bible-less Christians. They need God's Word to grow in their faith, find strength in persecution and know of Christ's love and grace.
